

Glossary

- The glossary defines terms for concepts that are commonly referenced when discussing XBRL.
 - For both, technical and non-technical topics
- At this point we have more than 70 definitions available, viewed 30,000+ times


Link Role Registry

Important part of the "extensible" nature of XBRL

- In process of taking over governance and developing new process:
 - Fits with remit to promote reuse of solutions to business problems
 - Add role-specific guidance as core part of process
 - XSB still provide technical governance

How to use multiple taxonomies in a single report

Different approaches



- Open consultation with people outside of the WG.
 - One of them helped to write the final guidance.

Collaboration with the ESG WG

 With the open consultation for the EFRAG ESG taxonomy TD-WG and XBRL Europe's ESG WG combined their forces

Both WGs looked into different parts of the architecture and explanation

 With this approach there was more time to answer the questions and give better quality feedback

Future activities and membership

Selecting topics

- Topic focus is all about helping to select a solution
 - Pro-active where solutions to the same problem may diverge
 - Reactive, where solutions have diverged
 - High impact, high relevance, timely

- Future Topic selection
 - Find things that we have an opinion on and perceived as important and can make a difference
 - Aligned with broader goals of the BPB e.g. "Interoperability"

Reflect the audience of the guidance

- Current core membership is vendors and standards-setters
 - Consider good, comparable data as a primary success factor
 - Taxonomies very important, but niche within individual organisations
- Nice to have more input from regulators, auditors and preparers and more geographical coverage

Collaboration plan


- Within core membership

 - Supports holistic approach, e.g. standards change + best approach to use it
- Special guests

 - Critical analysis, characteristics and consequences
 - Collaboration
